The HB Coding leadership team, bringing fresh expertise and perspective, initiated a comprehensive revamp of Epic system processes and coding workflows. This strategic pivot focused on updating antiquated workflows, maximizing technology use, and adopting cutting-edge practices in health information management.

This presentation includes an innovative approach for patients to access healthcare. Virtua Health's medical group paired two primary care practices for the creation of a Primary Care Neighborhood via a Shared Access Model. Patients are already familiar and willing to see another clinician in their PC practice. The model was built to offer access from our Digital First Primary Care practice to support the capacity constrained brick and mortar location.

Breakout Session 4C: Wrangling in Remote Rad Workstations – Grand Magnolia Ballroom A, B, C Shannon Wilson & Danielle LaPresta, Mass General Brigham

Remote radiology workstations have been slow to adopt in the academic space compared to that of private practice, mostly due to complexity and lack of dedicated resources. Mass General Brigham has rolled out 255 remote radiology workstations in the last 18 months and with that came a Medicare billing compliance nightmare. We will explain how MGB tracks, maps, and bills compliantly for Medicare reads within Massachusetts and beyond.
